DAVID'S THOUGHTS

Time was running out.

You know the story. God revealed to Abraham that he's going to destroy two entire cities - wipe them off the map for good. Abraham, who has a nephew in one, incredibly, engages in a "what if" game with the omnipotent creator of the universe. Basically, he asks God, "What if there are even a handful of people there who worship you?"

Instead of striking him dead for disrespect, God agrees. If there are 50 people there who are godly, he'll spare the town. And suddenly, like a riveting episode of Shark Tank, the negotiating is on! "Forty-five is nearly 50," reasons Abraham, "would you destroy the town because of just five less?"

In the end, it came down to 10. God agreed that 10 people would be enough to stop the rain of fire and, for some reason (perhaps wisely), Abraham didn't take it any further.

This story was in my mind last Sunday as I challenged each of us to create a "Top Ten" list of people whom we'd like to know Jesus better. People we interact with in our lives each week - at work, at home, at the gym, at the store...anywhere we are in the community. Surely, we can find 10. (You can still pick up a card in the HomeFront Center!)

When we stop to consider what Jesus has done in our lives, and then realize how much God personally values every person we meet, are we not compelled to share the "Good News" with them? But that doesn't mean we must whip out a Bible and read scripture to the guy in the supermarket this week - Awkward! We can start by simply investing our most valuable commodity in people; our time.

Stop and think how many times your schedule has prevented you from spending time with someone. Is our day made up more of busy apologies, polite exits, and, "sorry, gotta run" moments or times of deep connections, engaging conversations, and "how are you really doing" encounters? Whether or not we admit it, we set our own schedules and the priorities they naturally dictate.

So, join us as over the next 10 weeks, as we commit to changing our priorities and making time for people; people who need Jesus. Make a Top Ten list and then focus on doing whatever you can to help those people who are turning to God.


